**HOW TO "ADOPT-A-GIRL"**

The "Save the Girls" Campaign was born when the CAF Airpower Museum's rare Nose Art® collection was designated in 1999 as an official project of "Save America's Treasures," a joint project by the White House Millennium Council and National Trust for Historic Preservation.

The first phase of the "Save the Girls" Campaign provided capital funds for the construction and exhibit content of the new gallery that opened in 2001.

The "Adopt-a-Girl" program is one facet of the second phase of the "Save the Girls" Campaign that solely seeks endowment gifts. The interest income generated by the "Save the Girls" endowment provides perpetual care for the "girls," including conservation treatments, safe housing, environmental control and security.
